Good Friday worship will be offered via streaming on Friday, April 2.



EASTER GOODIE BAG FUN — Easter goodie bags will be available beginning on Palm Sunday, March 28, at Door 9 under the portico at the main entrance. Goodie bags will be available through Easter Sunday, April 4, or while supplies last. Bags contain activities appropriate for preschool - 5th graders.

GOOD NEWS! — Your Session is beginning to talk about when to re-open for indoor worship. Tentative plans include a start date of May 2 with two worship services, one at 9:00 am and one at 10:30 a.m. Both will be held in the Sanctuary. We will NOT begin Sunday school or childcare at this time. There will NOT be any coffee/fellowship following worship. Worship will be modified to support ongoing distancing advice. We will require masks. We will NOT take reservations prior to Sunday because at this time we think it is unlikely we will get more than 150 people per service and our Sanctuary can safely handle that. Please remember that your Session will make the final decision regarding when we begin in-person worship in our building.
