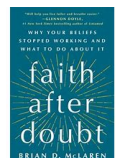
CIRCLE MEETINGS

Faith After Doubt: Why Your Beliefs Stopped Working and What to Do About It

Even before the current pandemic, sixty-five million adults in the US have dropped out of active church attendance, and about 2.7 million more are leaving every year. Most of these adults are not leaving in anger over the church’s conservative or liberal position on social issues; they are leaving quietly because their faith is falling apart as they struggle with doubt. Brian McLaren, author of *Faith After Doubt: Why Your Beliefs Stopped Working and What to Do about It*, maintains that our honest doubts are an integral part of our faith, and boldly asserts, “Only doubt can

save the world and your faith!" Join instructor, Ken Hockenberry, for our Wednesday Engage and Encounter Adult Education Class as we explore this new book together, and honestly face our own doubts, which can indeed strengthen our faith.
