From the Pastor

Easter is quite late this year, but I personally prefer late Easters because, rather than Easter being cold and dreary, we can experience Easter as it should be—warm, green and full of possibility. This Easter is actually quite special because it's the first time we will have been back in our Sanctuary for Easter since the beginning of the pandemic. It's also special because I have been waiting to preach this particular Easter sermon for a long time.

As many of you are well aware, I work pretty far ahead when it comes to my sermons. I plan out my sermon schedule in February, deciding what I am going to preach for September-August of the coming year. I spend a week holed up in my bedroom, researching scriptures and topics that I think might be relevant and important for the year to come.

For every sermon, I develop a primary and secondary scripture, then I jot down my thoughts about what I think might be important for that sermon. Sometimes I have a lot to say on a certain subject and I end up writing whole pages of the sermon in the notes. Other times, I only have the nugget of an idea and write very brief notes of where I think the sermon might go. By the end of the week, I've usually compiled together a 30+ page document of single spaced text.

I do this for a couple of different reasons. The first is a practical concern: it's hard for me to write a sermon and memorize it all in the same week. I like to have a little bit of distance between myself and the text. In fact, I really like opening a sermon and not remembering anything about writing it. This allows me to look at it with fresh eyes and invest time into the parts that need to be polished or completely changed.

The second is that by planning far in advance, I can find good stories or create special videos for the sermon, which would be impossible if I was writing my sermon the same week I was preaching it. You would be amazed how I end up finding

fascinating little tidbits of information and ideas that relate to various sermons I'm planning on preaching.

The third reason why I plan so far out is that, by allowing the sermons to ruminate in my subconscious, when I finally sit down to write, my brain has worked out a lot of what I want to say. Sometimes I will dream about a sermon and how the ideas should be structured. Often, contemplating my



WE ARE ALL

sermons over a long period of time helps me approach a topic from an unconventional perspective.

This is what happened to me two years ago right as COVID was ramping up. I had been inspired to write a very unique Good Friday and Easter sermon. I was very excited to preach them, but then everything shut down. I decided to set those sermons aside and recalibrate, using Easter to talk about the pandemic. Little did we know, at that time, how long the road would be to recovery and healing. The following year, 2021, I hoped I could use those two sermons, but, once again, I examined the landscape of where we were as a church and I felt that those two sermons were not appropriate for the time and place.

However, this year I feel the time is right for them. I don't often speak about my sermons ahead of time, but I am extraordinarily excited and proud of what I am going to bring you on Good Friday and Easter. For me, these sermons encapsulate so much of what I believe to be important about the Christian faith. Indeed, these sermons are a reflection of why I became a pastor in the first place. I'm not going to give away the content, but I will encourage you to be present in church on both of those high holy days as I believe you will find important inspiration for your soul that will draw you closer to God.

RefugeeOne is the largest resettlement agency in Chicago, in partnership with many churches and other organizations, and has welcomed thousands of refugees to the Chicago area since 1982.

HOW YOU CAN GET INVOLVED:

Mentor Team: We are looking for 6-10 people who can make a 6-month commitment to a refugee family. Attend the airport arrival, weekly visits and check-ins, assist with initial adjustments to Chicago (how to use public transportation – grocery shopping), help youth acclimate to school. Training is provided by RefugeeOne.

Make A Home Team: This team will be responsible for the gathering and set-up of the apartment. RefugeeOne will provide the list of items needed to prepare an apartment. While the collection of items can take some time, when we hear that our family will be arriving we will have several short days to turn the apartment into a home.

Advocacy and Education Team: While we are all busy gathering and welcoming a family to our area it is important to stay educated and advocate for policies that welcome newcomers to the United States. This team will work to keep our congregation informed and advocate for refugees rights, privileges and protections as needed.


PROGRESS ON STRATEGIC GOALS:


Internal Goal Subcommittee has started implementation and facilitation of three focus groups with the

MORNING CIRCLES 1, 2, 3


