From the Pastor Christmas Tableaus

This is my tenth year preaching the four Sundays in Advent. Over the last nine years, I've experimented with all kinds of different approaches to Advent. Since I like to produce original content for each sermon, coming up with something new

for Advent every year can be challenging because we are

limited to a handful of texts. Therefore, back in February of 2022, when I was reading over the scriptures associated with Advent, something popped out at me that I had never seen before every story hinges on an object that facilitates that story coming to life.

This doesn't just happen once. It happens over and over again, which led me to envision our Advent series for 2022 called Christmas Tableaus. A tableau is a fancy word for illustration, but what makes a tableau unique is that it is an illustration with religious overtones. If you've ever happened upon a tableau scene, it's usually


based off of a famous painting or photograph. The scene will be recreated with physical models of the objects within the painting or photograph. The idea in this series is that we are going to isolate one object from a scene associated with Jesus' birth and discuss its importance to our lives.

Hence, each sermon will utilize an object, animal or a thing (like stars). We will highlight the illustration and discuss how it informs the story of Jesus' birth and our faith

as Christians. In all, we will be examining five illustrations that are associated with Jesus' birth—a tablet, a sheep, a star, a treasure chest and, on Christmas Eve, a manger. Each week, when you come to service in Advent,

we will have these items as an object lesson in the sermon and, yes, this even includes live sheep!

Although each of these illustrations might seem insignificant in light of the larger purpose of Christmas, they are the lynchpin through which each of the various narratives of Jesus' birth are woven together. As we will



discover, each illustration holds particular significance to us as Christians. Not only do they convey important information about the person of Jesus and the messiah he was destined to become, but these illustrations also have a lot to teach us about how we are supposed to live as Christians.

Our Advent sermon series, *Christmas Tableaus*, will look at five illustrations, or tableaus, that are associated with Jesus' birth. Each sermon will take an illustration (which could be objects, animals or things like stars) and discuss how that illustration informs, not only the story of Jesus' birth, but also our faith. As we will discover, each of these illustrations within the birth narrative have particular significance to us as Christians in that



they tell us interesting information about the person of Jesus, who he was and how we are supposed to live as Christians.

Christmas Joy Offering

We will be receiving the Christmas Joy Offering on all the Sundays of December and at the Christmas Eve service.

This is a Presbyterian denomination Special Offering. Some describe it as an opportunity to share our love with the leaders of the church; past, present and future.

This offering, which has been taken for many years, is divided so half is used to support mission and church workers who have retired with modest pensions or others who are experiencing emergency needs. The other portion is directed for support of Presbyterian related schools and colleges which are equipping communities of color.

We have many stories and examples of how these funds were used to address critical financial needs. One example: Stillman College in Tuscaloosa, AL, was founded by Presbyterians and has become a training school for African American ministers. The Christmas Joy offering helped Stillman provide scholarships to gifted, promising students.

One young lady at Stillman wrote: "The money you give goes directly to the students and keeps them in college. Like me, many students often feel like they are hanging by a thread. Your donation fills in the threads and make a ropea lifeline of financial assistance."

Gifts to this offering also support the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions, which helps current and past church leaders and their families who are in critical financial need. Other retirees who have inadequate financial resources receive income supplements to move from uncertainty to stability. Last year, our congregation contributed over \$6,500. Let's make it our goal to exceed this amount is 2022. – Thank You.

On Saturday, November 5, First Pres partnered with the Master Gardeners – University of Illinois Extension to host a Pumpkin Smash. Community members were invited to bring

their pumpkins to our east parking lot where a dumpster awaited them. Why is a Pumpkin Smash important? When pumpkins end up in landfills, they produce methane gas. The Pumpkin Smash diverts this waste to a composting company and prevents the pumpkins from ending up in the landfills.

A Note from Pastor Judy

Dear Ones,

At the regularly scheduled Session Meeting on Sunday, November 13th, I told the Session that I believe God is



inviting me to retire as an active Minister of Word and Sacrament. The Session agreed that a motion to dissolve my call with First Presbyterian Church could appropriately be part of the business at our Annual Congregational Meeting on February 12, 2023. If the Presbytery concurs and the congregational vote is favorable, I will retire effective February 15, 2023.

I vividly remember the day I was called to be your Associate Pastor. It was the first weekend of February 2015 and there was a blizzard! If it hadn't been for the faithful who attended the 8:30 Finding Grace service, there may not have been a quorum to elect me as your associate pastor. Ironically, I will preach my last sermon as your called and installed associate pastor on the eighth anniversary of my call to this church. (February 5, 2023) We can do without the blizzard this time.

It has been a privilege to serve as one of your pastors these past eight years. I have baptized several and married a few and buried a lot – over 150 funerals in 8 years. I have preached and led Bible Studies. Throughout these eight years I have marveled at God's amazing grace in calling me to serve the church where my Christian discipleship began over sixty years ago.

Very few pastors get to return to the church of their formative years to serve in their later years. In my service here, I have often felt as though I was paying back the saints who guided me and supported me all those years ago. Some are still living; others surround us as a great cloud of witnesses. All that I have done in my service here has been done with the utmost gratitude to you, to those who have gone before you, and to God.

I would be remiss if I didn't mention the love and prayers with which you surrounded me about one year ago. I know that it was your love and prayers and that of people around the country that healed me and made me strong again. I still have a complete drawer full of your get-well wishes.

The call to serve this church has been so much more than words can express. I thank you from the deepest place in my heart. I thank God for each of you.

Highlights from the unapproved minutes from the November 13, 2022 meeting of Session.

Action Items

1. The Session approved a motion to accept new incoming officers after examination over lunch. Session welcomed and thanked these officers who will be installed and/ or ordained on Sunday, November 20, 2022. Session approved a Motion to allow incoming Elders to join the meeting at discussion.

- 2. Pastor Judy told the Session that she believes God is inviting her to retire as an active Minister of Word and Sacrament. The Session agreed that a motion to dissolve Reverend Judy Hockenberry's call with First Presbyterian Church could appropriately be part of the business at our Annual Congregational Meeting on Sunday, February 12, 2023. If the Presbytery concurs and the congregational vote is favorable, Pastor Judy will retire effective Wednesday, February 15, 2023. Session thanked Judy for her exemplary service with grace and love. She will be missed dearly.
- The Session approved a Motion that requested Trustees establish a Task Force to identify people in the congregation with special needs including people with short term or long-term disabilities following guidelines developed by the PC(USA). A Trustee would chair said Task Force and other at-large members will serve on the Task Force.



Session Highlights

Lindsey Landwehr-Fasules, Board of Trustees President, presented to Session proposed changes to the Trustees' Bylaws with rationale for changes. These proposed changes will be considered and voted upon at the next Trustees' meeting before returning to Session for approval. The congregation will be asked to approve these changes at the Annual Meeting in February 2023.

Lindsey Landwehr-Fasules, Board of Trustees President, updated Session on the construction project of the Hallway and Chapel and answered questions.

Gary Gehm, Chair of Administration & Finance provided details of our monthly finances. Budget discussions will continue through year end. Stewardship responses have started to come in, and we are hopeful that the campaign is successful.

Session has called a Special Meeting of Session later this month to continue conversations about budget and discuss cost-savings strategies moving forward.





ADVENT IN PLAIN SIGHT





Help Us Close Our 2022 Budget Deficit

Thanks again for your tremendous, steadfast support over the years. Your financial commitment has contributed to the success of our church's extensive programs and activities and has assisted in fulfilling our mission: Choose love. Be the light. Change the world.

Unfortunately, one of our challenges is that operating expenses continue to exceed revenues, and as reported last year, our operating budget for 2022 anticipated a deficit.

The most significant contributors to this deficit include greater costs associated with church operations, including construction costs relating to the Chapel and Memorial Hall projects; increased expenses in maintaining our infrastructure; continual decline in membership; current inflationary conditions; and the lingering effects of COVID.

The 'Ask' is this: If each Church member could consider giving an additional \$400 (or \$800 per couple) before year end, this would greatly reduce, or possibly eliminate, the 2022 operating deficit.

Simply put, if 500 members contributed an additional \$400 by year end, \$200,000 more could be applied to our operating budget.

We are aware of the current challenging economic conditions, but please consider this 'Call', as you often have in the past.

Your generosity is a blessing.
