COFFEE: GROUNDS FOR DISCUSSION & SERVICE — Sundays through April 16 (No Class: March 26 & April 9) / 10:30-11:30 am / Room 110 — Our Bible lessons will follow the theme Freedom, an adult Bible study by Cokesbury. The lessons explore the concept of salvation and God's gracious acts in redeeming us. They challenge we who have experienced God's gracious salvation to work for freedom and justice on behalf of others. They acknowledge that as we do, we will encounter those whose beliefs and values are different from our own, so they encourage us in ways to remain faithful to our beliefs while we act as neighbors to others. In the fall, we completed the "Rescue" portion of the study. This spring, we will finish up the two remaining parts called "Justice" and "Faithful Conversation."
