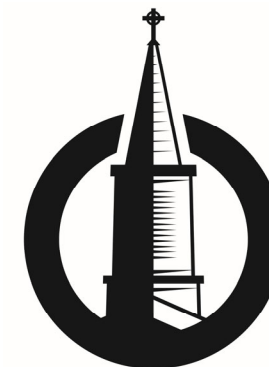

CURRENT GIVING OPPORTUNITY: Novi — Our Annual Speaker this year will focus on an organization working with children affected by the war in Ukraine. During the months of September, October and November, you have the opportunity to support their mission to provide emotional support, nutritious food and access to education for children living in Ukraine. 4.5 million children remain in Ukraine, and Novi works to provide care for these children who are exposed to violence, displacement and emotional trauma.



GUEST PREACHER, TOM COLE — *Sundays, October 15 and 22* — Tom grew up in Arlington Heights and was confirmed at First Pres. In 2021, he retired from a thirty-seven year career in investment banking on Wall Street. In 2008, Tom helped begin a non-denominational men's ministry in Manhattan (which he led until his retirement) and he currently serves on their national board, which oversees forty chapters around the country ministering to over 25,000 men. In 2019, he launched a new ministry, Faith in Financial Services, an organization that serves and connects people of faith who work in finance, where he is currently President. He also serves on a variety of nonprofit boards and mentors numerous business leaders.
