

\*GIVING OPPORTUNITY: PC(USA) Native American Church Property Fund - The Native American Church Property Fund assists with needed repairs of Native American churches and chapels in the Presbyterian Church, PC(USA). Repairing the infrastructure of Native American churches and chapels also supports the mission, ministry and presence of Native American congregations in the PC(USA). The need for funds to conduct urgent and immediate repairs and improvements, including health and safety repairs, will enable continued use of the facilities by congregations and the public who visit the churches. Currently, there are approximately ninety-five Native American PC(USA) congregations in the United States.

NEW ONLINE GIVING PORTAL — We will be transitioning to a new online giving portal, Abundant Online Giving. The new portal will allow members to cover the processing fee for online credit card giving. In 2022, we were charged \$11,000 in processing fees and we expect to be charged approximately \$9,800 in 2023. These are fees that could be going to the mission and ministry of First Pres.
