
Financial Update


The Administration and Finance Committee would like to thank you for your steadfast support of the Church through your generous gifts of time and money.

Through April 2024, we are observing a challenging start to the year. Although spending appears to be under control, giving to the Church has decreased significantly.

In order to cover Church expenses, monthly giving needs to be approximately \$114,000 per month. Based on pledges for 2024, we expected monthly giving to be approximately \$95,000 per month (creating the deficit). However, actual giving has been approximately \$81,000 per month, on average. We are currently experiencing an overall shortfall of \$132,000 through April 2024. You can see from the following chart that giving in January and April was particularly concerning.

Below is a summary of reserve balances (net of loans outstanding) and net operating income through April 2024. We have provided historical information for the past four years to help demonstrate the current financial condition of the Church. The loan outstanding to the Presbytery Investment & Loan Program (that helped pay for all the recent construction work on the Chapel and hallway) totals \$432,253 and carries an interest rate of 2.40%. This rate of interest is lower than what the Church earns on its excess cash and at a fixed rate until 2027.



Presbytery Update: 226th General Assembly

"Live into Hope"

As a member of the Presbytery of Chicago, I have been elected to represent our Presbytery at the 226th General Assembly. The theme of our gathering is "Live into Hope". You might be asking; what is the General Assembly and what is its purpose?

The General Assembly is a council of the church, a discernment event, and a worshipping body. Commissioners gather for committees and plenary sessions to discern the direction of the church and make decisions that are implemented throughout the life of the PC(USA).

The General Assembly meets every two years, and this year it takes place between June 25 and July 4. The first part of the gatherings will happen on Zoom and the last week I will fly to Salt Lake City, Utah, where the entire assembly will meet in person.

As a commissioner, I am assigned to a specific committee, and at this assembly I will be serving on the International Engagement Committee. We will receive items of business related to events, concerns and opportunities in an international context. This includes items related to international peacemaking.

Please keep all our commissioners in prayer as we do this hard work of discerning where God is leading our churches in the years ahead.

Thank you to all who participated in the three Mission Study Sessions in March and April through in-person groups and the on-line at-home versions. Your engagement with the questions for reflection have helped us gather important insights about the church – who we are, who God is calling us to be and what kind of pastoral leaders we will need for the road ahead.

The next steps involve in-depth analysis of those sessions as well as the responses gathered from last fall's Connection Group conversations, focus groups from 2022 and the church assessment from 2020 (CAT/Holy Cow). To help us conduct this phase as thoroughly and thoughtfully as possible, we will work under the leadership of Todd Hjermstad, long-time friend of the congregation, and leader of the 2022 Focus Groups.


Our goal is to have a Congregational survey in mid-June so that congregation-as-a-whole can weigh-in on how we are answering the primary questions (below) that will inform the work of the Pastor Nominating Committee. A presentation for the congregation will be planned for late June.
