SEPTEMBER BOOK STUDY — *Sunday, September 29 / 12:00 pm / Boardroom* — **Refugee High** (Winner of the Studs and Ida Terkel Award) — *Refugee High* is a riveting chronicle of the 2017-18 school year at Sullivan High, a time when anti-immigrant rhetoric was at its height in the White House. Even as we follow teachers and administrators grappling with the everyday challenges facing many urban schools, we witness the complicated circumstances and unique education needs of refugee and immigrant children: Alejandro may be deported just days before he is scheduled to graduate; Shahina narrowly escapes an arranged marriage; and Belenge encounters gang turf wars he doesn't understand. Equal parts heartbreaking and inspiring, *Refugee High* raises vital questions about the priorities and values of a public school and offers an eye-opening and captivating window into the present-day American immigration and education systems.

***CURRENT GIVING OPPORTUNITY: Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) Tornado and Windstorm Fund** — Through September, Sunday morning bookmark donations will support *the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Tornado and Windstorm Fund*. In response to the outbreak of tornadoes resulting in widespread damage in the Midwest and elsewhere, the Mission Committee has voted to direct the bookmark funds to the PDA Tornado and Windstorm Fund. This fund supplements the One Great Hour of Sharing Offering to enable a significant response to tornadoes and windstorms. This might include immediate relief, long-term rebuilding and emotional/spiritual care.

PADS UPDATE — We have been spending the summer focused on revamping our PADS (Public Action to Deliver Shelter) program, and it has come to our attention that the PADS area is in need of significant restoration that will take some time to complete. We have established a Steering Team to oversee the functioning of PADS and this team will provide a broader base of people to advise us as we move forward. Because there is so much work to be done, we have decided to postpone the opening of PADS until January 2025. For many of you this will be a disappointment, but we simply need more time to complete our tasks of restoring the area and increasing our volunteer base. If you have previously supported this outreach monetarily, we encourage you to continue as we will still need financial support when our doors open again in January. The PADS Steering Team includes: Amy Hempleman, Cathy Mataloni, Mark Bishop, Sue Dean, Darl Pochert, David Hogan and Chuck Yedor.
