WORKING WITH CHILDREN IN UKRAINIAN WAR ZONE — Sunday, October 20 / 9:00 am Presentation and Update in the Boardroom; 10:45am Interactive Event in Fellowship Hall following Children's Time in worship; 10:00 am and 11:30 am Fellowship in the Parlor - Greet Jon and Hannah Peerbolt — Our relationship began with this incredible organization last fall. You may remember the special sunflower ornaments made from Kiev newspapers. Novi is focused on assisting children affected by the war in Ukraine, who are deprived of basic needs; including safety, education and nutrition, and are exposed to violence, displacement and emotional trauma. Novi's "Life Kits" help children develop self-regulation skills through structured adult-led interventions, and they collaborate with local organizations to prioritize sustainability and building partnerships that focus on prevention and intervention for vulnerable children.
