



SIXTH ANNUAL MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. DAY OF SERVICE COMMUNITY FOOD AND HOUSEHOLD ESSENTIALS DRIVE —

Sunday, January 19 & Monday, January 20 / 9:00 am - 12:00 pm — The MLK Day of Service is an annual event held nationally to encourage communities to take action to build the beloved community of Dr. King's dream. MLK Day is the only federal holiday designated as a National Day of Service to encourage all to volunteer to improve their community. Donations can be dropped off in the lobby on Sunday, January 19, during worship services. On Monday, January 20, drop off your non-perishable food and paper good donations at the front steps of the church. Volunteers will unload your donations from your car. Walk-up donations are also welcomed. All donations will go to local pantries. When deciding what to donate, here are some helpful hints: household items such as paper towels, toilet paper, and dish detergent are not eligible for purchase with a Link card; consider pop-top lids as sometimes people do not have a can opener; olive oil, garlic, salt, pepper and other spices can transform a meal; remember items like Hamburger Helper are only good if you have ground beef; baking mixes that require only water are better; coffee is a luxury; sugar and flour are always needed; Kraft Mac & Cheese requires milk and butter, consider Velveeta that comes with the sauce.
